



There are multiple ways to share videos with your clients and/or friends:

- 1) [Include a link to the video in your blog or email](#)
- 2) [Embed a video in your blog](#)

## Include a link to the video in your blog or email

On the video, click on the sideways 'V' icon. (Figure 1)

Click **Get Link** and then **COPY LINK**. (Figure 2)

Now you can paste the link anywhere you want; blog, email, website etc.

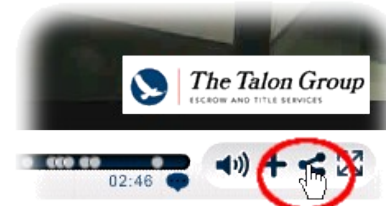

## Embedding a video into your Blog

On the video, click on the sideways 'V' icon. (Figure 1)

Click **Embed** and then **COPY CODE**. (Figure 3)

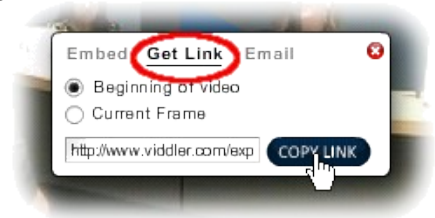

Pasting the code into: [Blogger](#)  
[TypePad](#)

### Pasting the code into Blogger

Log into your Blogger account and compose a new post for your blog. Select the **edit HTML** tab, and paste the code you copied from the Talon video into your new post.

### Pasting the code into TypePad

Log into your TypePad account and compose a new post for your blog. Select the **Edit HTML** tab and paste the code you copied from the Talon video into your new post. **Note:** if you are using the Plain Text editor, you will not see the **Edit HTML** tab on the Compose page, and you can paste the code directly into your post.

### Pasting the code into WordPress

Because of the way WordPress works you cannot use their Visual Editor to embed a video. So when you want to create a post that includes a video, you must first turn this feature off.

- a) Click on **Users** and go to **Your Profile**
- b) Uncheck **Use the visual editor when writing**
- c) Click **Save**

Now you can create your post and embed the video. Just paste the code you copied from the Talon video into your post, write up anything else you want, save it and you're done. Then turn the Visual Editor back on. If you ever need to edit the post which has the embedded video, you must turn the Visual Editor off again before you edit the post.

That is just one method; there are actually several ways to get the same result in WordPress, some of which require additional WordPress plugins.

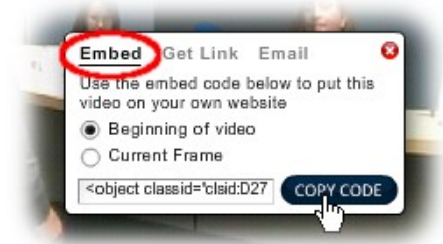
